I came home with a full bumper set, two full grills, both package trays for the convertible, rear side windows and their tracks, dash and door aluminum trim pieces and boxes of interior and exterior trim parts. Most of the parts are dirty but in good shape. The price was too good to turn down free. I offered but he would not take anything for the parts.

I have also received a set of front brake parts (drums, shoes and so on) and a brake booster from a person that replaced his with disk brakes. All of these parts are from a 1963 car and they should also fit 1961-2.
