I had permission from Marilyn so I drove her 63 convertible.





Caroffle Month

The first part of 1964 I started looking for a 1964 Thunderbird. The dealer did not have exactly what I wanted so I special ordered one. On March 10, 1964 the dealer called and said my new car was in and ready to pick up. For 24 years it was my everyday driver and was also great for pulling a boat when I went camping with my kids. 1988 was the last year camping with my kids. That year it was parked in a very damp garage and was never used again. In 2009 I decided to take a look at my beautiful 1964 Thunderbird. It was in very bad shape, with 4 flat tires and no battery. What happened to my battery? It was not the beautiful car as I remembered. There was lots of surface rust everywhere, the body, the chrome and even under the hood. It was covered in dust and dirt. This car had too many great memories to let it die in some junk yard. It deserved better. The first thing was to get it off the ground with some new tires. The car always had white wall tires. Costco special ordered me some new tires, they had to be white walls. Six more months went by. The next thing was a new battery. The car had not been moved and the engine not started in 22 years. The car was towed to a garage. My first thought was in a few weeks or a month the 64 would be "ON THE ROAD AGAIN". Wrong! No guick tune up or cheap paint job. The car deserved better. Only a full and complete restoration would do. The next thing the engine came out so the engine compartment could be redone. Everything had to be replaced or cleaned and repaired. All chrome came off and all paint came off down to bare metal. The body was solid except for surface rust. The car is now 99.99% rust free. The car was painted the original color. The interior is still all original except for new foam in the front bucket seats and new carpet on the floor. The interior is once again beautiful. The car now looks as good if not better than it did new. I forgot.....one of the first things I did was to get rid of the trailer hitch. This car will never tow a boat again. It has been over 4 years since this project was started and it is still not finished. It is getting close. Sometimes I wonder if it will ever be done. There always seems to be one more thing to do. It still







only has 60,000 original miles. It is a 1964 and I want it to look like a 1964, that is why it is still 99% stock. The new cars today might run and drive better, but in my opinion none, not one, look better. This car is over 50 year old. How many new 2015 cars will still be one the road in 50 years. I would bet zero.
