


Note from the Editor

Flight Log #1 Niles Canyon Railway

It started off as a nice day and only got better as the day went on. We arrived at Sunol on time and met up with another dozen people from the Valle del Sur, Antique Automobile Club from Morgan Hill. Again mostly modern iron with one "retro bird" and Marilyn's '63 convertible (without her as she was under the weather). Bill's '66 arrived later for lunch.



We soon got our tickets and boarded our steam train for a ride through Niles Canyon on the same right of way that carried the final leg of the transcontinental rail line of 1869.



Our timing was great as we found that our steam locomotive was making it's last run for about 2 years. It's going in for a full overhaul and refurbishment.

The Niles Canyon Railway is a completely volunteer nonprofit that keeps the tracks and rolling

stock working and running. When SP gave up the line they tore up most of the tracks. Slowly this group is working to lay new track and one day the line will continue to Pleasanton.



It was a beautiful ride with lots of flowers and green hills. We could also see just how much water came down the canyon during this winter's heavy rain. It's hard to imagine just how high the water was in the canyon.

After a nice train ride we went across the street for a lunch in the old hotel. I don't think we will give them very high ratings since lunch was very slow coming out and then they had trouble telling the different between fish and shrimp.



After lunch most headed home but a few continued back down Niles Canyon to the town of Niles to browse the antique stores and the Essanay Studios. Just as a note: a future tour to Niles could take up a full day of antique stores, shops and the studio.

Today we have a second generation Thunderbird owner. Vince Bertoni from down in Fresno has sent in this picture of his Dad's 1966 Thunderbird convertible. His Dad passed away in 2012 so now Vince drives the T'Bird around Fresno. Much of the time it is pulling his Kawasaki 750 triple that is dubbed "the widow maker" (there must be another story behind that name). Vince raced this motorcycle in the 80's. Vince states that "if you think this car is cool, then you should have met my Dad".

Tim Van Raam sent this picture to me with a comment that he thought it looked like a Thunderbird. It is

the 1964 Chrysler Turbine car. A little research showed why. The car was designed under the direction of Elwood Engel. Sound familiar? Engel worked for Ford and was instrumental in the design of the 1961 to 1966 Thunderbirds. At Chrysler he also directed the design of the mid 60's Imperials. Funny, they had many of the same styling traits of the 60's Lincoln Continentals. Of the 55 original turbine cars only 9 are left and only 5 have active engines. Jay Leno has one of the active engine cars.
